## TEACHER TOOLKIT – Mandal Level

### Objective of iVision Youth Parliament

To give students an opportunity to:

- Develop **confidence, communication and leadership** skills.
- Learn to **speak and think critically** on global, national and state issues.
- Participate in structured **Youth Parliament–style consultations** and propose practical solutions.

### Role of Teacher Coordinators

- **Nominate 2–3 students** from Grades 6–8 who are enthusiastic, curious, or confident speakers.  
(Language support in Telugu or Hindi is allowed.)
- Help students understand their **topic and committee** through briefing sheets.
- Conduct **short speech practice** in class (1–2 minutes).
- Accompany students to the Mandal Youth Parliament and **support participation**.

## Key Guidelines for Teachers

| Step | Action                    | Details                                         |
|------|---------------------------|-------------------------------------------------|
| 1    | <b>Student Selection</b>  | Pick 2–3 enthusiastic students                  |
| 2    | <b>Orientation</b>        | Explain their committee and topic               |
| 3    | <b>Speech Preparation</b> | Guide them to make a 1–2 min speech             |
| 4    | <b>Practice</b>           | Do a short in-class rehearsal                   |
| 5    | <b>Participation</b>      | Accompany students on Mandal event day          |
| 6    | <b>Debrief</b>            | Encourage students to reflect & share takeaways |

## How to Guide Students for Their Speech

1. Begin with:  
“Honourable Chair, respected delegates and fellow participants...”
2. Introduce their role/country:  
“I represent [Role/Country].”
3. Explain the issue from their perspective.
4. Propose 1–2 clear solutions.
5. End respectfully:  
“Thank you.”

## Sample:

“Honourable Chair, I represent India. Our youth believe climate action must begin in our schools. We propose water conservation campaigns and tree planting drives in every community. Thank you.”

## Judging Parameters

| Parameter         | Description                          |
|-------------------|--------------------------------------|
| Content           | Relevance and clarity of ideas       |
| Clarity of Speech | Confidence, volume, and fluency      |
| Logical Flow      | Clear problem–solution structure     |
| Presentation      | Posture, tone, and respect for rules |
| Time Management   | Speech within 1–2 minutes            |
